

Short introduction to Online Examination

Written examinations, or examination components that require invigilation, may be taken either on campus or remotely as an online examination. Students may choose the option that best suits their individual circumstances.

If you opt for an online examination, you will be supervised in real time via video and audio by university invigilators during the examination.

Before the examination begins, your identity will be verified using your university student ID card.

To help ensure academic integrity, you will be supervised from two different angles:

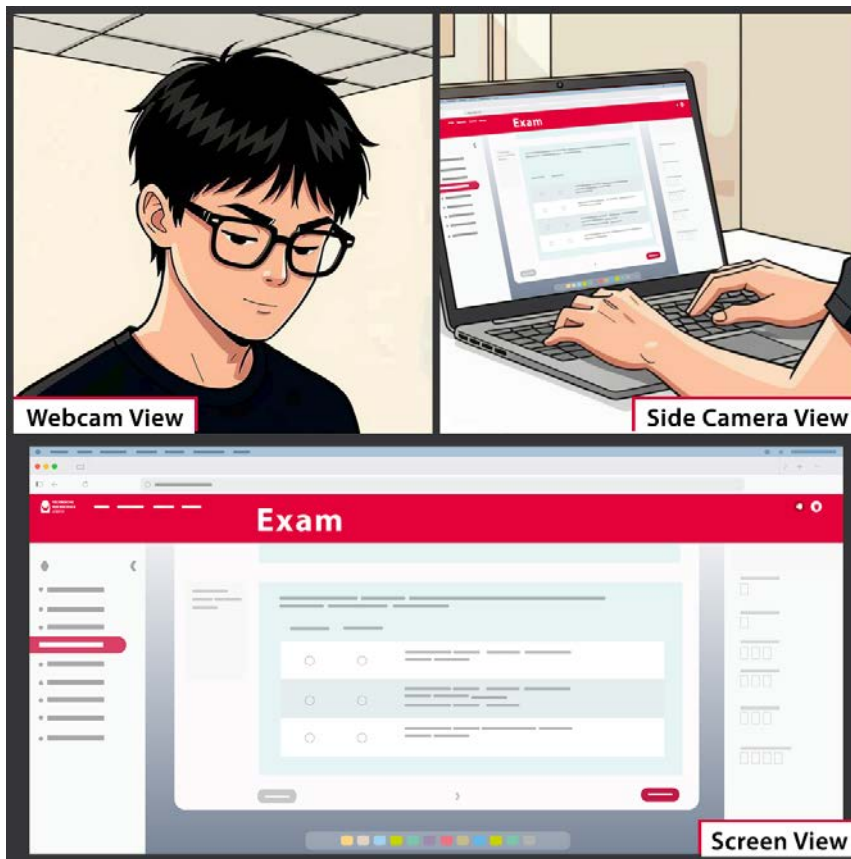
- Webcam view: Your face and upper body are visible through your computer's webcam.
- Side camera view: A second mobile device (smartphone or tablet) is positioned beside you so that the invigilator can see your hands, arms, keyboard and computer screen.

You must also share your entire screen so that the invigilator can ensure that only authorised applications and resources are used during the examination.

Your computer's microphone must remain active throughout the examination to enable the invigilator to detect any unauthorised communication.

Views Available to the Invigilator.

The examination will not be recorded. No software needs to be installed on your computer or mobile device.

- The following requirements must be met in order to sit an online examination:
- A computer (desktop PC or laptop/notebook) with internet access, equipped with a webcam, microphone and speakers (built-in or external). The use of headsets is not permitted.
- A mobile device (smartphone or tablet) with a camera. This device is used as a second camera to provide a side view of your workspace, including your hands and computer, during the examination. A tripod is recommended to ensure stable and correct positioning.
- A stable internet connection with a minimum upload speed of 1.5 Mbit/s to ensure reliable real-time transmission of video and audio.
- The latest version of a supported operating system and a current web browser.

Before the examination, you should complete a system check to ensure that your equipment meets the technical requirements.
